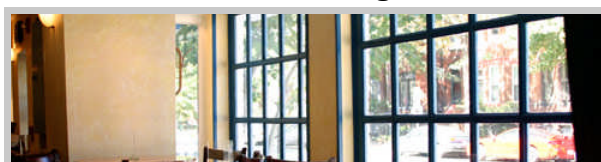
- **The Transportation study and its effects on Columbia Heights redevelopment**
